Change in Daily program at the school

We are changing the daily program this term. The first session each day at 9am will consist of practical hands-on group classes. Turns will then be interspersed between other sessions during the day – and the previous classes will set up activities for people to explore when they aren't having their turn.

Here are some ideas of activities which you can engage in during turn time

- There are often other teachers present during turn time who will be giving extra turns. They will have their name on the board with "Extras" written above them, and once again you can write your name up under them. It's a matter of first in first served
- Third year students may also be available to work with other students. They have the option of putting their name on the board also.
- Observation. One of the skills we develop over time is the skill of diagnosis and assessment of patterns of use. Observation of others turns is often valuable in this regard.
- Mirror work. In the studio you can arrange the mirrors so that you can work on yourself as Alexander describes in his own case in "Use of the Self"
- Anatomy study there is a good range of different anatomy books in the school library.
 These are not available for borrowing outside of the school, but studying these gives a wide range of different perspectives on different aspects of anatomy. Also there is a box of bones, a skeleton and each other to play around with.
